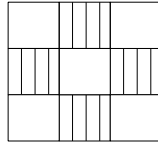


Create With Claudia Mystery Quilt Along 2020

Use a scant ¼ inch seam allowance

Fabric requirements listed are generous • Arrows indicate pressing direction
Cutting instructions are for all of the blocks needed for the month



January Block – Nine Patch



Welcome to the first month of the first ever Create with Claudia mystery quilt along. I hope you have a great time and that you love the quilt you make!

We are kicking things off with an easy nine-patch that will measure 6 ½ inches by 6 ½ inches square. You are going to need eight total. Don't worry, it may sound like a lot, but these go together in no time.

Fabric Requirements

Fabric A  – 1 Fat Quarter * Fabric B  – 1 Fat Quarter

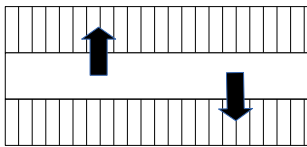
Cutting (For All Blocks)

Five strips of Fabric A – 2 ½ inches by 21 inches

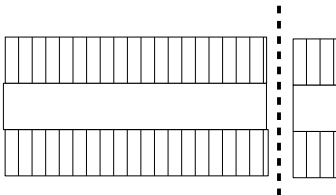
Four strips of Fabric B – 2 ½ inches by 21 inches

Block Assembly

Using two strips of fabric B and one strip of fabric A, sew together lengthwise as shown:

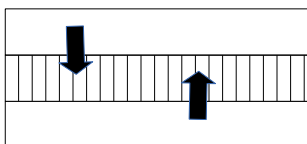


You will have one unit that is 6 ½ inches by 21 inches.



Even off one end and cut 8 units, 2 ½ inches wide.

Repeat the process, but this time use two strips of Fabric A and one strip of fabric B.



Unit measures 6 ½ inches by 21 inches

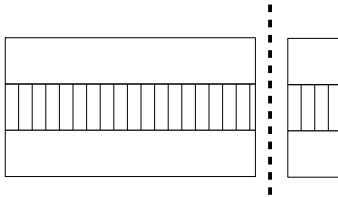
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Create With Claudia Mystery Quilt Along 2020

Use a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ inch seam allowance

Fabric requirements listed are generous • Arrows indicate pressing direction
Cutting instructions are for all of the blocks needed for the month

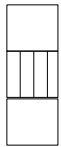
From this unit you will be able to cut eight pieces, $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide.



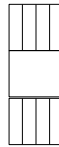
Cut pieces will measure $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide by $6\frac{1}{2}$ long.

Repeat one more time, using two strips of fabric A and one strip of fabric B.

When done, you will end up with the following units:



16 of these units
(Unit X)

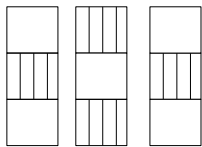


8 of these units
(Unit Y)

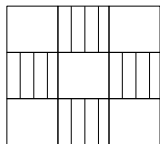
Completing the Blocks

Each block needs two of Unit X and one of Unit Y.

Sew together the block as follows:



Lay out the units in this pattern and then sew the long sides together.



Your finished block should look like this and measure $6\frac{1}{2}$ inches by $6\frac{1}{2}$ inches square.
Repeat until you have a total of 8 blocks.

Clue: Next month we will be doing another square block that is half as easy as this one, even with a triangle thrown in.
