
Scrap Busting Patriotic Table Runner



Use up those small scraps you have been hanging onto and turn it into this patriotic table runner. The design may look complicated, but it is not. It just takes a bit of organization.

Finished Size: Approximately 21" x 42"

1/4 inch seam allowance used

Fabric Requirements

For the top: $\frac{3}{4}$ yard – Red scraps

½ yard – Blue Scraps

½ yard – White

Other: Backing: 1 yards

Batting: 1 yards

Binding: As needed, depending on binding method

Cutting

2" Squares

- From red fabric 172 squares
- From blue fabric 124 squares

2 1/2" Squares

From white fabric – 32 squares

3 1/2" Squares

From white fabric – 8 squares

4 1/4" Squares

- From red fabric 1 square
- From blue fabric 7 squares


Block Assembly

Flying Geese


Before assembling the various units (referenced by letters in the layout diagram on the last page), make the flying geese units.

You will need the 4 ¼ inch squares and the 2 ½ inch squares.


To make one set, first – Draw a diagonal line on the back(wrong) side of the four small squares.




Next – Line up one of the small squares on top of the large square with right (front) sides facing. Line up another small square on the opposite corner.



Cut along the line that was previously drawn and press open, so that you have two units like this.



Using one of these units, take another one of the 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch squares and line it up on the remaining corner (right sides facing).





Using a scant ¼ inch seam, sew along both sides of the drawn line.


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

Cut along drawn line, press open. Repeat with the other unit. You will have four flying geese units. Trim them down to the size needed: 2 inches by 3 ½ inches.










Repeat all steps with the remaining 4 ½ inch squares. When done, there should be a total of 32 flying geese (4 with red in the center and 28 with blue in the center).

Blocks

This table runner is broken into various blocks that are different sizes. The blocks are assembled, then sewn into columns. Then the columns are sewn together to make the runner. The following blocks are labeled with letters which correspond to their placement as shown in the pattern diagram.

Block A - 12 blocks needed

9 red squares are needed to make one block A.



Sew the squares together to get this block.






Repeat until you have 12 of these blocks.

Block B - 2 blocks needed

12 red squares are needed to make one block B.









Repeat until you have 2 of these blocks.

Block C - 4 blocks needed

8 red squares are needed to make one block C.

Sew the squares together to get a this block.







Repeat until you have 4 of these blocks.

Block D – 4 blocks needed

4 blue squares are needed to make one block D.



Sew the squares together to get a this block.







Repeat until you have 4 of these blocks.

Block E – 4 blocks needed

12 blue squares are needed to make one block E.

Sew the squares together to get a this block.







Repeat until you have 4 of these blocks.

Block F – 4 blocks needed

6 blue squares are needed to make one block F.

Sew the squares together to get a this block.







Repeat until you have 4 of these blocks.

Block G – 3 blocks are needed

4 blue squares and 2 blue flying geese are needed to make one block G. Sew the squares together to get a this block.







Repeat until you have 3 of these blocks.

Block H - 6 blocks are needed

4 blue squares and 1 blue flying geese are needed to make one block H. Sew the squares together to get a this block.








Repeat until you have 6 of these blocks.

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Scrap Busting Patriotic Table Runner

Block I - 2 blocks are needed

One 3 ½" white square, 2 blue flying geese, 2 red flying geese, and 4 red squares are needed to make 1 block I. Sew the squares together to get a this patch block.



Repeat until you have 2 of these blocks.

Block J - 6 blocks are needed

One 3 ½" white square and 2 blue flying geese are needed to make 1 block J.

Sew the squares together to get a this patch block.



Repeat until you have 6 of these blocks.

Table Runner Top Assembly

Lay out the blocks as indicated in guide on the following page, using the letters as a guide for the block placement.

- Make sure everything is in the correct order.
- Then piece each column together.
- Lastly, sew each column together.
- Quilt and bind as desired.
